



BYE-LAWS OF CRICKET NAMIBIA

2020/2021

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1. SCOPE

These bye-laws regulate the National club leagues played under the auspices of Cricket Namibia. Cricket Namibia is responsible for and governs the following in respect of the Cricket Namibia Club League:

- a. Organization and administration of club league cricket in all regions;
- b. Assist the appointed Cricket Committee(s) when and where required;
- c. Ensure that club league statistics and logs are kept and published promptly on the Cricket Namibia website; and
- d. Manage appeals resulting from disciplinary action instituted by the appointed Disciplinary Committee.
- e. A Cricket Committee will be appointed by the Cricket Namibia Board to oversee the following matters.
- f. Appointment of Disciplinary Committee;
- g. Review and amendment (if necessary) of club league bye-laws on an annual basis;
- h. Drafting of match fixtures and league structure; and
- i. Ensure that clubs identify umpires and scorers in respect of each team that the respective clubs register for a given club league season.

2. APPLICATION OF THE LAWS OF CRICKET

- a. The Bye-Laws, Rules and the Laws of Cricket, under which Cricket Namibia Club League Cricket is to be played, shall in order of precedence be:
- b. Bye-Laws of Cricket Namibia, 2020/21 Cricket Season, Premier 1st & 2nd Division 50/40/30 over's and T20 Leagues;
Cricket Namibia Playing Conditions: Men and Women
Standard ICC 50 Over and T20 League Match Playing Conditions Men and Women;
and Laws of Cricket 2017 Code – and addendums thereafter.
- c. These Bye-laws are to be reviewed and amended (if necessary) on an annual basis by Cricket Namibia and the Appointed Cricket Committee(s) and approved by Cricket Namibia at a Board meeting.
- d. These Bye-laws are valid from 1 October 2020 till 31 July 2021 when the revised Bye- laws for the 2020/21 season will come into force.

3. LEAGUE STRUCTURE

As scheduled and determined by Cricket Namibia

4. OFFICIAL ATTIRE

- a. The official attire for players in all official Cricket Namibia league fixtures will be:
- b. Premier League and 1st Division in all formats: Coloured trousers and shirts with the branding of the club sponsor as approved by Cricket Namibia with coloured leg pads. The 2nd Divisions will be white trousers and a coloured shirt with the branding of the club sponsor as approved by Cricket Namibia.
- c. A player's shirt must be tucked in at all times whilst on the field.
- d. Failure to comply with this will result in the umpires submitting a report to the Cricket Committee, as a result one log point will be deducted. Three offenses in a season will result in an N\$1000-00 fine, deducted from the teams next travel claim.

5. BALLS

The following shall apply in terms of match balls:

- a. Cricket Namibia will provide the **“Cricket Match Balls”** throughout all leagues and formats. No other balls may be used for scheduled club league matches; failure to comply will result in the loss of the points for that game. Match Balls to be handed out to Clubs, before season collected and signed by club members.

6. HOME GROUND

Every club entering teams in the Cricket Namibia Club League shall indicate which field will be used as their home field.

7. FIELD AND PITCH PREPARATION

The following will apply at all times:

- a. The team reflected first on the official fixtures as issued by Cricket Namibia shall be regarded as the home team;
- b. The home team shall be responsible for the preparation of the field and pitch, in conjunction with the venue's grounds man and/or chairman of the relevant club.
- c. Irrespective of the prospect of rain, all pitches where matches will be played shall be covered on Thursday and Friday evenings. Covers shall be removed at 07:00 on Fridays and Saturdays if there is no rain or no prospect of rain. The covering of the pitch and removal of covers are responsibilities that reside with the home team;
- d. Should the home team fail to prepare the field and pitch, irrespective of whether it is a neutral venue or not, such home team will forfeit the match points in favor of the opposing team should the field and pitch be unplayable, unless otherwise decided by the Cricket Committee. The forfeiture of such points will count as a “win” for the visiting team and the net run rate will be adjusted as described above.

8. REGISTRATION OF PLAYERS:

- a. No individual player playing in any of the leagues must be registered with more than one club.
- b. No individual shall be allowed to play for any other club without first being registered with that club.
- c. No individual shall be allowed to play for more than one club simultaneously during the season. This refers to the Cricket Namibia Senior and Junior club league and all other affiliate leagues in the country

9. CLUB, TEAM AND PLAYER REGISTRATION

- a. The Premier League will consist of teams as described by Cricket Namibia.
- b. Winning the 1st & 2nd Division, a promotion / relegation match is a requirement for a team to be promoted to the Premier / First League respectively.
- c. All clubs will advise Cricket Namibia of the teams it wishes to enter for the forthcoming Club League Season by no later than 01 August of a given year. It must be clearly stated which teams are to participate in which league. No new club will be allowed to register for league purposes after 1 August of any given year;
- d. All clubs shall allocate a registration number to each player. The registration number shall be indicated on every team list and result card forwarded to Cricket Namibia. The registration number for a player will not change as long as the player remains a member of the relevant club.
- e. Registration numbers will be allocated chronologically and clubs will not reallocate (old) numbers to new members.
- f. Each Premier League team registered to play under the auspices of Cricket Namibia must have at least 1 (one) player of colour per match (excluding 12th man). At least 2 (two) players of colour must play in each of the First and Second League matches respectively (excluding 12th man)

10. TRANSFERS

10.1 TRANSFER OF PLAYERS BETWEEN CLUBS

- 10.1.1 A player has the right to transfer to another club other than the one initially registered with for a given season. Such transfers will only be granted if the following conditions were complied with:
- 10.1.2 The player involved must submit a written application to his current club, indicating his intention to leave. A written clearance (release) of the club which a player wishes to leave must be given within 14 (fourteen) days from date of

resignation and may only be subject to the completion of all financial responsibilities to the club, limited to club fees, clothing and penalties imposed as a result of disciplinary action and;

10.1.3 In the event of compliance to (i) above the club from which the player wishes to transfer must submit written consent to such transfer to Cricket Namibia.

10.1.4 The reference to financial responsibilities above does not become obsolete at the end of any season and a player remains responsible for settling all outstanding debts even if he decided to leave a club at the end of a season. A player may not play for a new club (even in the subsequent season) if all debts are not settled with his previous club

10.2 INTERNAL TRANSFER OF PLAYERS BETWEEN TEAMS

10.2.1 All clubs should approach this matter with integrity and abide by the ethical guidelines embedded in the Spirit of Cricket.

10.2.2 Should a team, or players from a team, indulge in any actions that are deemed by CN to be detrimental to the good spirit of cricket and the league, then CN are entitled to take mandatory action as deemed appropriate. This may include, but is not limited to, suspension of players, loss of points or exclusion from the competition. CN's decision will be final.

10.2.3 A member of one team of a club shall not play for a lower team of that club, (irrespective whether it is the same league or not) unless he has been replaced on merit. A player so replaced, shall remain in the lower team for a minimum of 2 consecutive competition matches. This is to stop loading in order to win specific matches.

10.2.3 Notwithstanding, a player playing for a higher team due to vacancies caused by players playing for the national team or non-availability of players due to work or any other acceptable reason, will be allowed to play for the lower team when the replaced player return, without any restriction.

A player who has played for a team in 2 out of the 3 competition matches immediately preceding the date on which that team has no competition fixture, shall not play for any lower team in a competition on that day.

Clubs who manipulate their teams will forfeit all log points related to the relevant match and will be penalized with an additional 4 points, irrespective whether the team won or lost the match in question.

Clubs replacing Players shall indicate on the team lists (**See Annexure 1**) to be submitted to CN on Fridays before 12:00, which player/s replace which Player/s in the higher Division team.

11. APPOINTMENT OF UMPIRES

11.1 The Cricket Namibia Umpires Association will be responsible for umpires' appointments for Domestic Cricket League.

- 11.2 Priority appointments will be from Premier League down to 1st and 2nd Division pending availability of umpires on a weekly basis

12. DATES, VENUES AND POSTPONEMENT OF MATCHES

- 12.1 Cricket Namibia will compile the fixtures in consultation with the appointed Cricket Committee(s). The fixtures, as approved and distributed by Cricket Namibia for a given Club League Season, may only be changed in the following instances:
 - 12.2 By mutual agreement (in writing) of both clubs involved and upon informing Cricket Namibia of the proposed change and new date and venue that is acceptable for both clubs and Cricket Namibia;
 - 12.3 Cricket Namibia will be informed at least five working days (Monday 12:00 prior to the scheduled match) in advance of the change of fixture;
 - 12.4 The **“RESPONSIBILITY”** falls in the club (s) to inform Cricket Namibia, Cricket Committee and the Namibia Cricket Umpires Association.
 - 12.5 All proposed changes should be confirmed in writing which may be done by e-mail between Cricket Namibia, the clubs involved, Umpires Association and the Cricket Committee.
 - 12.6 If no change is agreed upon then the side unable to fulfil the fixture will forfeit the points.

13. SUBMISSION OF TEAM LISTS AND MATCH RESULTS

The following shall apply and must be adhered to by all clubs in terms of the submission of team lists and match results:

- 13.1 All clubs will submit relevant team lists, in accordance with the approved electronic format, to Cricket Namibia by not later than 12:00 on the Friday preceding the Saturday of the matches in question.
- 13.2 The team lists will be available at Cricket Namibia as from 13:00 on the following Monday in question; (Was Tuesday)
- 13.3 The team lists for the entire season will remain on the Cricket Namibia Web-site and will not be removed;
- 13.4 When the toss takes place, the captains of both teams will submit hard copies of their respective team lists as per annexure 5 of the Bye-Laws to the umpires, who in turn will submit these to the scorers;
- 13.5 Cricket Namibia Result Cards completion will not be required for Premier, and 1st Division for matches scoring on Webcricket: The below information must be completed correctly on team registration sheet circulated before the first league matches.

- ✚ Fixture information, namely the date, venue and commencement time of the match
- ✚ Names and surnames of umpires
- ✚ Names and surnames of scorers
- ✚ Names and surnames of team captains
- ✚ The innings summary of both sides
- ✚ Names, surnames and club registration numbers of players on both teams Outcome(result) of the match

13.6 The format of the result and other evaluation cards will be distributed electronically one (1) week prior to the first match of the season;

All result cards for the 2nd Division in terms of a weekend's matches irrespective whether a match was played or for whatever reason not played, must be forwarded electronically to Cricket Namibia at stats@cricketnamibia.com by not later than 10:00 on the ensuing Tuesday.

Note: No faxed copies of result cards will be accepted and all match summaries must be completed and submitted on the approved result card format;

13.7 Cricket Namibia will confirm receipt of result cards by email to all clubs by each Tuesday at 12:00.

13.8 Should a club submit its result cards later than 10:00 on the prescribed Tuesday, one (1) log point will be deducted from the team in terms of which a result card was not submitted on time;

13.9 Match Report cards for lunches in Premier League matches, cards for pitch preparation and evaluation cards for official umpires (those appointed by the Umpires Association) must be completed after the game, signed by both Captains and handed back to the umpires who officiated the match.

13.10 If a club does not have a scorer for a match, then it is obliged to accept the result card as submitted by the opposing club. The onus also rests on the club without a scorer to obtain the result card in question from Cricket Namibia in order to update its own records;

13.11 All Premier League and 1st Division results of matches will be on the Webcricket web site directly after the matches of the preceding Saturday. The results and stats will remain on the Webcricket for the duration of the season;

13.12 Both teams must submit result cards for matches not played indicating that the match did not take place. The result card should contain the following:
 Fixture information, namely the date, venue and commencement time of the match; Reason why the match was not played.

14. WITHDRAWAL OF SIDES AND NON-FULFILMENT OF FIXTURES

14.1 The following penalties will be imposed in respect of the withdrawal and non-fulfillment of fixtures:

- 14.2 A team that withdraws or neglects to fulfill its obligation in terms of a fixture will forfeit a total of eight (8) log points. Four (4) log points in respect of the fixture in question, and an additional four (4) log points as a penalty-
- 14.3 Matches allocated to a team due to the withdrawal of opponents, will count as a “match won” for the team who was ready to play. In terms of the calculation of net run rate the following will apply:
- 14.4 In circumstances where a match (and the points for such match) is awarded to a team as “as result of refusal to the play”, to the other team by the umpires in accordance with Law 21.3(a)(ii) or in accordance with the provisions of the relevant event agreements signed by the participating teams, the net run rate of the defaulting team shall be affected in that the full 50 overs of the defaulting team’s innings in such forfeited match shall be taken into account in calculating the average runs per over of the defaulting team over the course of the relevant portion of the competition. For the avoidance of doubt the runs scored and over’s bowled in such forfeited match will not be taken into account when calculating the net run rate of the team to whom the match was awarded.
- 14.5 Clubs are obliged to ensure a full complement of players in respect of Premier League sides. The 1st & 2nd Division team cannot play while the club’s Premier League side withdraws for whatever reason. Should a team withdraw for whatever reason and a lower team of the club plays on the relevant Saturday, then both the teams will forfeit such match league points. In addition, both teams will be penalized with the deduction of an additional four (4) log points. The side which receive the league points will count the match as a “match won” and the net run rates will be adjusted as indicated above.
- 14.6 In circumstances whereby a Club or Team from a specific league and for filling remaining fixture, all log point for and against will become null and void.

15. SHORTAGE OF PLAYERS

The following shall be applicable to fielding of a cricket side:

- 15.1 No team will be allowed to play in a club league match with less than seven (7) players. Should a team arrive for a scheduled match with less than seven (7) players, it will be deemed as a no-show;
- 15.2 Should a team have less than seven (7) players at the time of commencement of a match (50 over Premier League and 40 overs First Division at, 30 overs Second Division at, Playing times as per Allocated fixtures) (T20 Respective Divisions Playing times as per Allocated fixtures), the team with seven (7) or more players shall be awarded the match and the points for a win. The match will also count as a “win” for the team with seven (7) or more players and the net run rate will be adjusted as described above;
- 15.3 A team will be suspended for the season if the team turns up for more than three (3) matches with less than seven (7) players.

15.4 Should a team be suspended for the remainder of the season (for whatever reason), the progress of such team up to the point of suspension be deleted from the log. Log points awarded to opponents of the defaulting team will be removed entirely from the log.

- Both Captains informed by Umpires
- Excepted and signed on Teams Sheets
- If Available on Umpires Device only



17. PLAY-OFFS, SEMI-FINALS AND FINALS

The following shall be applicable in terms of play-offs and finals in respect of a specific club league season:

- No finals shall be played prior to the last scheduled match on the fixtures for each league; Playoff Module 1 Vs 4 & 2 Vs 3 - 1 and 2 have home games in semi-finals, Highest ranked team in Final has Home advantage. T20 Semi-finals and Finals venue as decided by Cricket Namibia.
- The semi-finals and finals in respect of 50 and 40 overs formats will not be played during the same weekend, **i.e. semi-finals on the Saturday and finals on the Sunday**. This regulation will ensure that the Sunday is open for a reserve day if the match on Saturday could not be completed under DL. Should it still be impossible to decide on a winner if play should be carried over to the Sunday, then the highest ranked team on the log will be the winner;
- The dates of the play-offs will be determined by Cricket Namibia fixtures;**
- Cricket Namibia is responsible for providing lunches and drinks (2 x 330 ml water and 2 x 500 ml energy drink per player per innings) during semi- finals and finals in the Premier League;
- Cricket Namibia is responsible for the provision of drinks (1 x 330 ml water and 1 x 500ml energy drink per player per innings) during play-offs in the 1st & 2nd Division;
- The ceremony for the hand-over of the competition Cup will be held immediately after completion of the finals Arranged by Cricket Namibia and Cricket Committee
- Players playing in the semi-finals and finals of the Premier League will not be allowed to play in the play offs or finals for the 1st & 2nd Division.

viii. A player will only be eligible to play in a semi-final and/or final match in respect of the Premier and 1st & 2nd Division if such player played at least two (2) official league matches per season prior to the play offs for a specific club;

ix. All National Players, who regularly played for the National Team during the season, is exempted from this ruling.

Club Players selected to represent Namibia in International matches during the 2020/21 Cricket Namibia Season, must be indicated on Club's team sheets. These players will be exempted from Rule 16. viii if National team and Club fixture falls on the same date. Students with a playing history of more than 2 season at a specific club will be exempted, such proof must be provided before start of season by submitting players team lists indicated student players in particular.

1st / 2nd Division TEAM PLAYOFFS

- i. In the 1st Division only, Central & Coastal will play their respective semi-finals and finals.
- ii. The two finalists of the respective 1st Division Central and Coastal will progress to a National Championship Cup Play-Off in the 40 over format. Regional T20 Championship Knock-out will be contested by Central top 3 teams (two finalists and highest ranked losing semi-final team), Coastal Top 2 Teams (Finalists) and Winner of 2nd Division; Venues T.B.A by Cricket Namibia
- iii. Premier semi-finals and finals will be played on turf pitches.
- iv. 1st Division semi-finals and finals will be played on turf pitches if venues are available.
- v. 2nd Division semi-finals and finals will be played on turf pitches if venues are available.

18. DETERMINING PLAY-OFF TEAMS INCASE OF EQUAL LOG STANDING AT THE END OF A SEASON

In the event of teams finishing on equal log points in a given league, the right to play in the playoffs will be decided in the following order of priority:

- i. The team with the most wins in respect of club league matches during the current season;
- ii. If there are teams with equal log points and equal wins, the team with the best net run rate will progress;
- iii. Should the log points, wins and net run rate of teams be equal, the team that won the most matches between the two participating teams in question; and
- iv. In the highly unlikely event that teams cannot be separated by the above criteria, a final decision will be based on a "flip of a coin".

19. PROMOTION / RELEGATION MATCHES

At the end of the regular cricket season, the winner of the 1st Division may apply to Cricket Namibia for Premier League Status for the following season.

A Promotion/Relegation challenge can be requested by the 2nd Division Winners against the lowest ranked team in the 1st Division 40 overs format. The match will

take place on the home ground of the team being challenged, if such team does not have a home ground Cricket Namibia will advise a neutral venue.

20. BOUNDARIES

The boundaries of all grounds shall be circular and marked. In instances where there is no acceptable boundary rope at the field, the outer boundary will be clearly marked by placing cones approximately 5m apart. **No bricks** will be allowed for marking the boundary due to the risk of injury.

21. PRACTISE FACILITIES

Home teams should ensure that their practice facilities are available to opposition teams on match days.

22. PROVISION OF FOOD AND DRINKS

The following shall apply in respect of the provision of food and drinks:

Premier League:

The home team is responsible for the provision of food for both teams, scorers and umpires. The home team will be responsible for drinks for themselves, umpires and scorers.

Lunches of an **acceptable** standard in respect of quality and quantity shall be provided by the home team. If the standard is not acceptable as per lunch reports, the Cricket Committee will investigate the reported matter.

A neutral venue means both teams play at a venue away from their Home venue. In the Premier League, the team deemed as the home team is responsible for supplying lunch and drinks to both teams, scorers and umpires.

1st & 2nd Division:

The home team will be responsible for drinks for themselves, umpires and scorers. Opposing teams will supply their own drinks.

No lunches will be provided during First League/ Second Leagues matches.

23. RULING

Any ruling on the interpretation and application of any of the Bye-Laws contained herein shall be addressed to the appointed Cricket Committee; which in turn shall provide a ruling. The relevant case will be referred to Cricket Namibia if the appointed Committee is unable to provide a ruling.

Cricket Namibia shall have the sole right to decide whether its members are playing in the spirit of cricket and to take corrective action should Cricket Namibia decide that its members are not playing in the true spirit of the game.

24. DISPUTES BETWEEN CLUBS

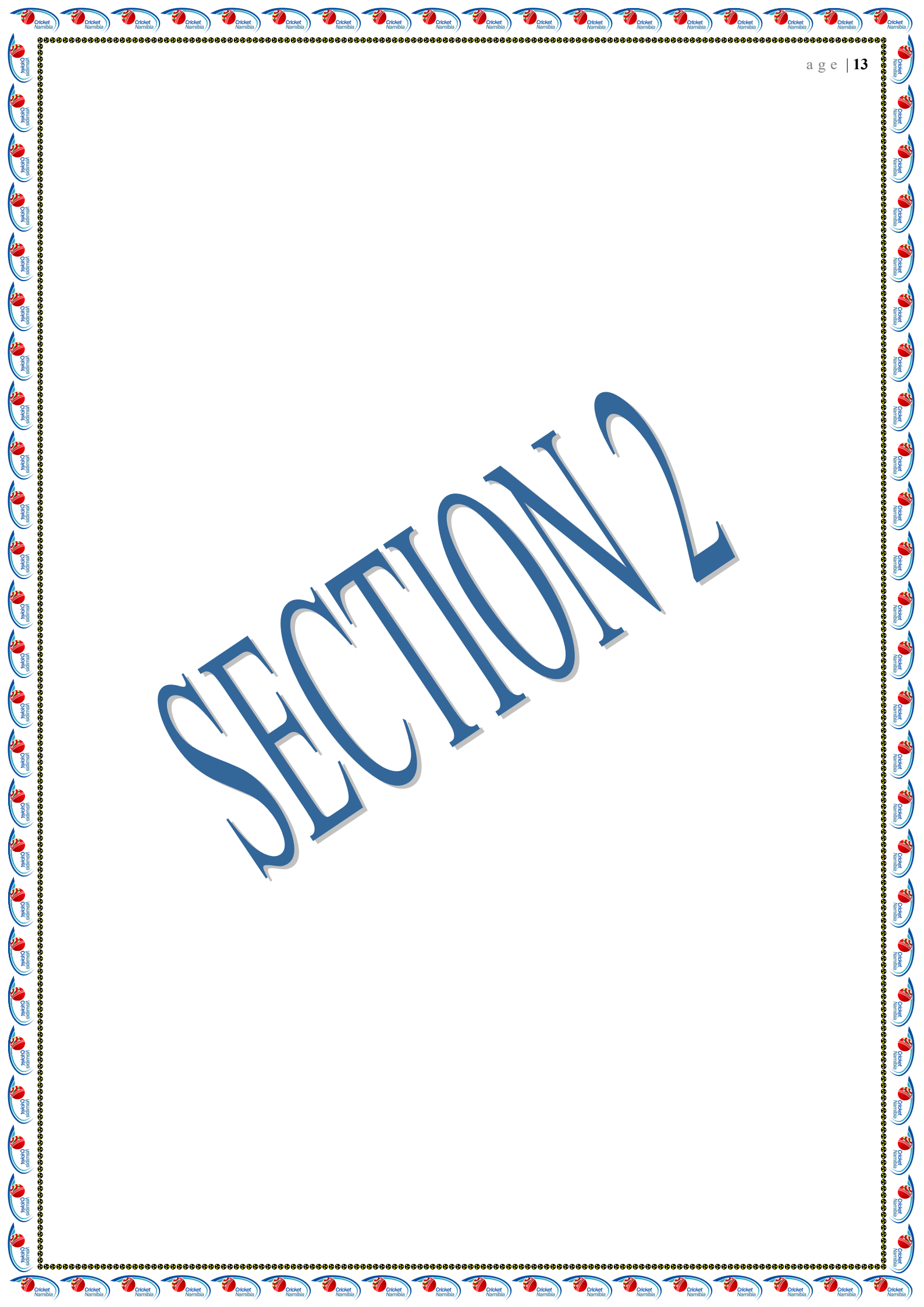
The following shall be applicable in respect of disputes between different clubs:

- 24.1 Any dispute between clubs in any competition shall be referred to the Cricket Committee convened for the specific purpose of deciding on the dispute.
- 24.2 A dispute must be submitted in writing within three (3) days after the dispute occurred. The Cricket Committee shall then set a hearing date and inform the clubs involved at least 48 hours before such hearing to enable them to present documentation regarding the related matter. The Cricket Committee will notify the relevant clubs of the outcome of the hearing within 48 hours after such hearing was convened; and
- 24.3 A right of appeal on the decision of the Cricket Committee (as appointed by Cricket Namibia) must be submitted to the CEO of Cricket Namibia within 48 hours of the outcome of the hearing;
- 24.4 Any player, official or spectator that breaches the Code of Conduct as contained in the Constitution and COC of Cricket Namibia, will be dealt with according to the guidelines of the said Constitution and COC.

25. CONDUCT OF PLAYERS

Refer to the Rules and Code of Conduct of Cricket Namibia

26. TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.

26.1 Cricket Namibia will determine the amount for travel allowances on an annual basis.

26.1.1 **Annexure 6 (COPIES TO BE MAILED TO ALL CLUB MEMBERS)**

26.1.2 Travelling Umpires will be paid through the Umpires Association.

26.1.3 Travelling claims should still be completed on the prescribed travelling claim form (see **Annexure 2**) and submitted to admin@cricketnamibia.com, and operations@cricketnamibia.com at Cricket Namibia. by no later than 08:00 on the Wednesday morning of the week subsequent after away match played.

26.2 Failure to comply and submit to the following will also result to forfeiting of travel allowance payment.

26.2.1 Premier and 1st Division not scoring live on WebCricket without valid reason

26.2.2 Not complying to 2nd Division results cards submission as per Bye Laws 13.6

27. SUBSCRIPTION FEES

The following applies in respect of subscription fees for the 2020/21 season:

N\$2,000.00 is payable per team taking part in the Premier and 1st & 2nd Division. The subscription fees are to be paid before the first match is played, irrespective of whether Cricket Namibia issued invoices or not. **Review fixture after season amount of home matches played**

Clubs without playing facilities will be required to pay N\$5,000.00 per team.

Clubs who share facilities will be required to pay N\$2,500.00 per team.

CN will supply a list with all Clubs who paid their subscription fees to the Chairpersons of all Clubs. Clubs who do not pay said subscription fees before the start of any play-offs, will not be allowed to play in such play-offs. They also will have no right to appeals during disputes with other Clubs.

28. SCORERS FEES

The following is applicable in terms of scorers and scoring:

All clubs will supply a scorer for every match. Should a club fail to do so, the club in question will be penalized by one (1) log point. In the case of a discrepancy on the score sheet where only one scorer was used, the benefit of the doubt will go to the team who supplied the scorer;

Claims for scorers should be submitted to Cricket Namibia **on a monthly basis** on the prescribed form (see **Annexure 3**) to development@cricketnamibia.com

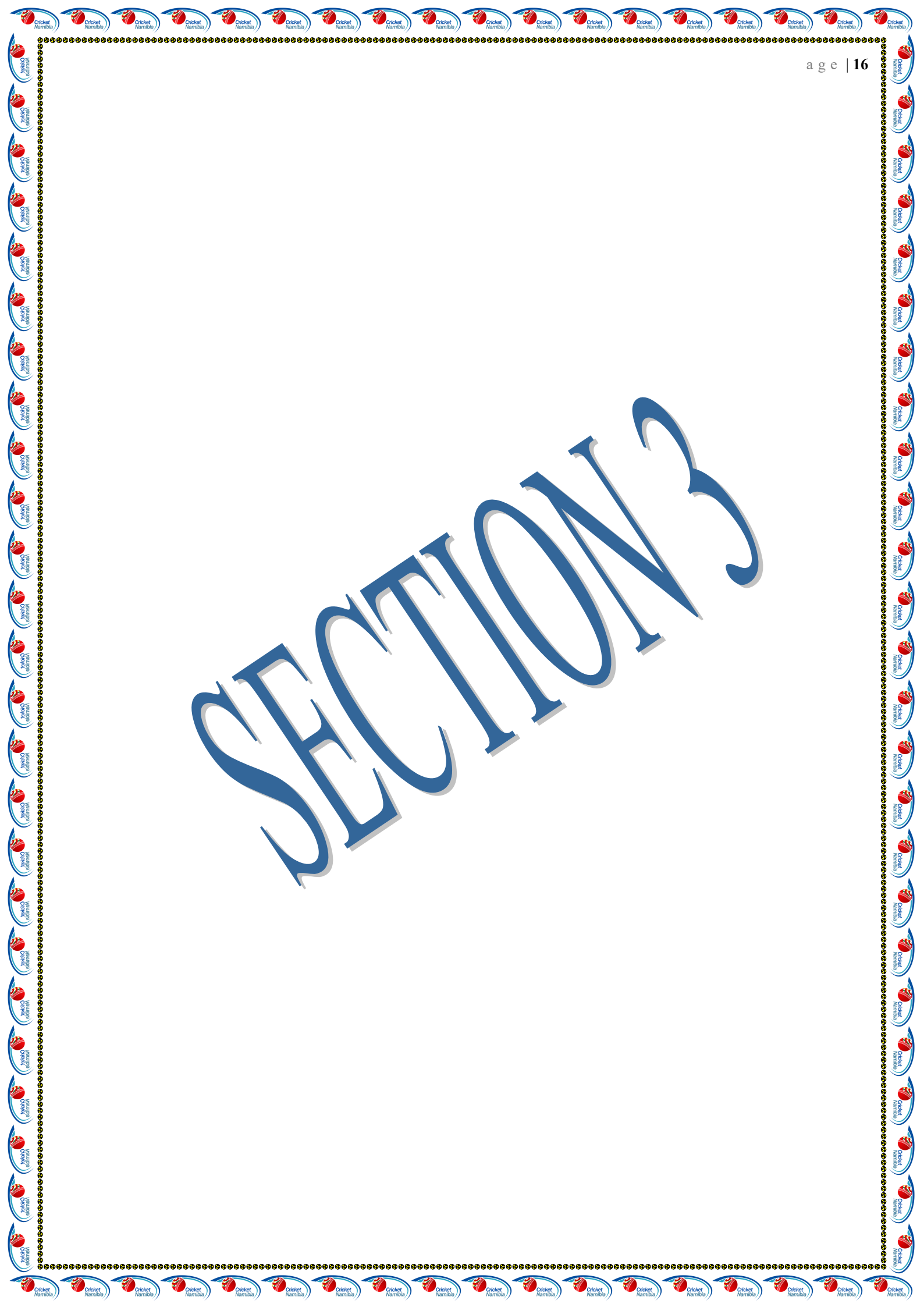

Bonus Points Premier League 50 Overs

Aim

The aim of the bonus points is to:

1. Refresh the way we think when playing cricket.
2. Teach our players to continue giving their best even in a difficult match situation.
3. Ask players to think outside the box on the field.
4. Reward good performances even in a losing cause.
5. Teach our club cricketers to use the full 50 overs.
6. Bring a new dimension into the game.
7. Promote the preparation of fair cricket wickets by the home club.

Winning Margin Bonus Points

Bowling the team batting second out for less than 80% of the total runs of the team batting first earns a **match bonus point** to the winning team.

If the team batting second scores the winning runs within the allotted overs, they will receive one bonus point for each 10 overs not used.

- Within 40 overs 1
- Within 30 overs 2
- Within 20 overs 3
- Within 10 overs 4

Duckworth Lewis/Shortened Innings

If reduced overs are required due to a break in play caused by rain or other influence, the batting bonus points will be re-calculated as follows:

Divide the total scored by the overs batted then multiply by original over scheduled.

Example 1. In a fifty over game the innings are each reduced to 41 overs.

Team one scored 239 in 41 overs, team two scored 219 in 41 overs

- Team one $(239/41) \times 50 = 291$ which gives 6 batting bonus points
- Team two $(219/41) \times 50 = 267$ which gives 5 batting bonus points

Example 2. Team one scores 277 in 50 overs. Rain reduces second innings to 32 overs. The team gets 187.

- Team one gets 6 batting bonus points.
- Team two $(187/32) \times 50 = 292$ which gives them 6 batting bonus points.
